This year is the 45<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Terry Fox Run.


## **Terry Fox Run**

## A Trip to The Station Food Hub

In an exploration of the Statement of Inquiry "Individual and societal choices in food production and consumption have local and global impacts on sustainability," the Grade 7/8 class visited The Station Food Hub just outside of Windsor. Here are some excerpts from their reflections on the field trip:

"Today, the grade seven and eight class visited The Station Food Hub and learned how they take farmers' produce that couldn't be sold, and process it so it can be. This is one of many ways they make themselves sustainable. By buying the seconds produce, the farmers make money for their produce that otherwise would have been thrown away, and as [Founder] Rebecca [Tran] said, "it's a win-win situation" ...because, the farmers get paid, but then the TSFH can sell their product for a profit, and with the money they can keep running and expand to different foods...Overall, The Station Food Hub is one of the most sustainable companies that I have ever seen or been to. They just have so many amazing ways to keep the earth clean and stable." (Max, Grade 8)

"Even though there are many sustainable development goals that The Station Food Hub strives to accomplish, the most important one for them is 'Zero hunger'. Because they are a food based corporation it comes to no surprise that "Zero hunger" is their main drive, although in the presentation they made it clear that 'Responsible consumption and production' and 'Clean water and sanitation' are important to them too." "The Station Food Hub is an organization that focuses on local food, helping the environment by reducing food miles and making more sustainable food in Nova Scotia...The Station Food Hub is a growing organization but it is still hugely impacting food production in Nova Scotia and is showing a really good example for other businesses and will hopefully inspire other places to do the same thing."




